## Acts 1

Written by Luke the doctor, same man who wrote the gospel. We know that he was a physician (Colossians 4:14).

- · We know that he was a Gentile (from his name).
- · We know that he was a devoted companion of Paul (from the text of Acts, and Colossians 4:14,Philemon 24, and 2 Timothy 4:11).

To Theopholus (lover of God). Probably real person but also symbolic.

Most probably written during Paul's imprisonment in Rome since it doesn't mention the outcome, so in the early sixties AD.

We see the birth of Christianity, the Church .The expansion from Jerusalem to Rome is a remarkable story. "Humanly speaking, [Christianity] had nothing going for it. It had no money, no proven leaders, no technological tools for propagating the gospel. And it faced enormous obstacles. It was utterly new. It taught truths that were incredible to the unregenerate world. It was the subject to the most intense hatreds and persecutions." (Boice)

- Matthew 28:18-20- Then Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth, Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you, and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the age"
- Mk.16:15-18-And He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned. And these signs will follow those who believe. In My Name they will cast out demons, they will speak with new tongues, they will take up serpents and if they drink anything deadly it will by no means hurt them, they will lay hands on the sick and the will recover."
- John 13:34-35- A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love one for another.-
- John 15:9 through John 15:17 (NKJV) <sup>9</sup> "As the Father loved Me, I also have loved you; abide in My love. <sup>10</sup>If you keep My commandments, you will abide

in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love. <sup>11</sup> "These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full. <sup>12</sup> This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. <sup>13</sup> Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends. <sup>14</sup> You are My friends if you do whatever I command you. <sup>15</sup> No longer do I call you servants, for a servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I heard from My Father I have made known to you. <sup>16</sup> You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you. <sup>17</sup> These things I command you, that you love one another.

- v.4-8 baptism of the Holy Spirit is not the same as regeneration- the apostles have the Holy Spirit in them- see John 20:22
  - it is the empowering of His Spirit not just a power but the only power
  - Not an influence, not an offshoot or byproduct but the Power
  - it is not your gift or talent

power- there is nothing too hard for Him to do- Luke 1:37,

He can do far more than we think- *Eph 3:20 Now to Him who is able to do* exceedingly, abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us.

The power of the Holy Spirit is not for flash and entertainment It is to used for boldness in proclaiming the gospel. Also includes power to heal those who are sick and afflicted.- Luke 5:17

v.6&7 although we are to be aware of the times, our focus **is not to be so concerned about when but about what we should be doing u**ntil He comesour focus is not to be dates and times but to spread the gospel

John 7:37-39 (NKJV) 37 On the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. 38 "He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." 39 But this He spoke concerning the Spirit, whom those believing in Him would receive; for the Holy Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

## Luke 11:9 through Luke 11:13 (NKJV)

<sup>9</sup> "So I say to you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. <sup>10</sup> For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened. <sup>11</sup> If a son asks for <sup>£</sup> bread from any father among you, will he give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will he give him a serpent instead of a fish? <sup>12</sup> Or if he asks for an egg, will he offer him a
