Who was in the crowd? Jauris and daughter, blind and lame healed, Lazarus, His mother, Saul/Paul,

(Dan_9:26) The seventy weeks are divided into three parts:

- Seven weeks - 49 years, until the city and its walls are rebuilt
- 69 weeks (7 plus 62), 483 years from the decree, until Messiah the Prince appears
- A final 70th week to complete the prophecy

What happens after the first sixty-nine weeks.

And after the sixty-two weeks Messiah shall be cut off, but not for Himself; and the people of the prince who is to come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary. The end of it shall be with a flood, and till the end of the war desolations are determined.

After the sixty-two weeks Messiah shall be cut off: The Biblical term cut off is sometimes used to describe execution (see Gen_9:11 and Exo_31:14). The Messiah will be cut off for the sake of others, not for Himself.

Hebrew word shabua means seven- the context here is 70 groups of seven or 490 years

Decree- Artaxerxes to Nehemiah in March 5, 444 BC in Nehemiah 2:1-8

- 173,880 days later on Hebrew calendar brings us to March 30, 33 AD when Jesus entered Jerusalem on the colt of a donkey

“There was only one occasion in our Lord’s earthly ministry on which He is depicted as presenting Himself openly as Zion’s King, the so-called ‘Triumphal Entry,’ recorded in each one of the Gospels and fulfilling

- On that day, Jesus deliberately arranged the event to present Himself as Messiah (Mar_11:1-10)
- On that day, Jesus welcomed praise (Luk_19:38-40) instead of quieting it **Luke 19:41-42 Now as He drew near, He saw the city and wept over it, (42) saying, "If you had known, even you, especially in this your day, the things that make for your**

peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes. • On that day, Jesus made special reference to the importance of that day (Luk_19:41-42)

In Matthew 2 they recognized that the time for the Messiah to be born was upon them

As we have seen here, they recognized that the time of Messiah manifesting Himself was upon them

Matthew 24, we are told when to anticipate the return of the Messiah

Look up, your redemption draws near
